



Launch Mission Execution Forecast

Mission: Falcon 9 Amazonas-6

Issued: 4 Feb 2023 / 0930L (1430Z)

Valid: 5 Feb 2023 / 1732 – 2132L (05/2232 – 06/0232Z)



Forecast Discussion: The forecast has trended unfavorably based on this morning's high resolution model guidance. The strong cold front that pushed through yesterday will remain to our south today, and a strong pressure gradient will bring windy onshore flow. Tomorrow, the front will begin to migrate back northwards, and some energy aloft will cause a low to spin up along the remnant boundary. While there is still some uncertainty as to the exact strength and location of the developing low, showers and storms will push back into the area by tomorrow morning into the afternoon. The low's center will likely be just off the coast by the start of the launch window, pushing eastwards as the evening progresses. Because of this, there is a higher probability of violation at the beginning of the window, with the primary concerns being the Cumulus Cloud Rule, Thick Cloud Layers Rule, and the Disturbed Weather Rule.

Conditions improve significantly by Monday afternoon, as the low moves off to the east and a reinforcing high pressure moves in. The only concern for the backup day is the slight risk of a Cumulus Cloud Rule violation.
