



INTELSAT G-37 MISSION

MISSION OVERVIEW

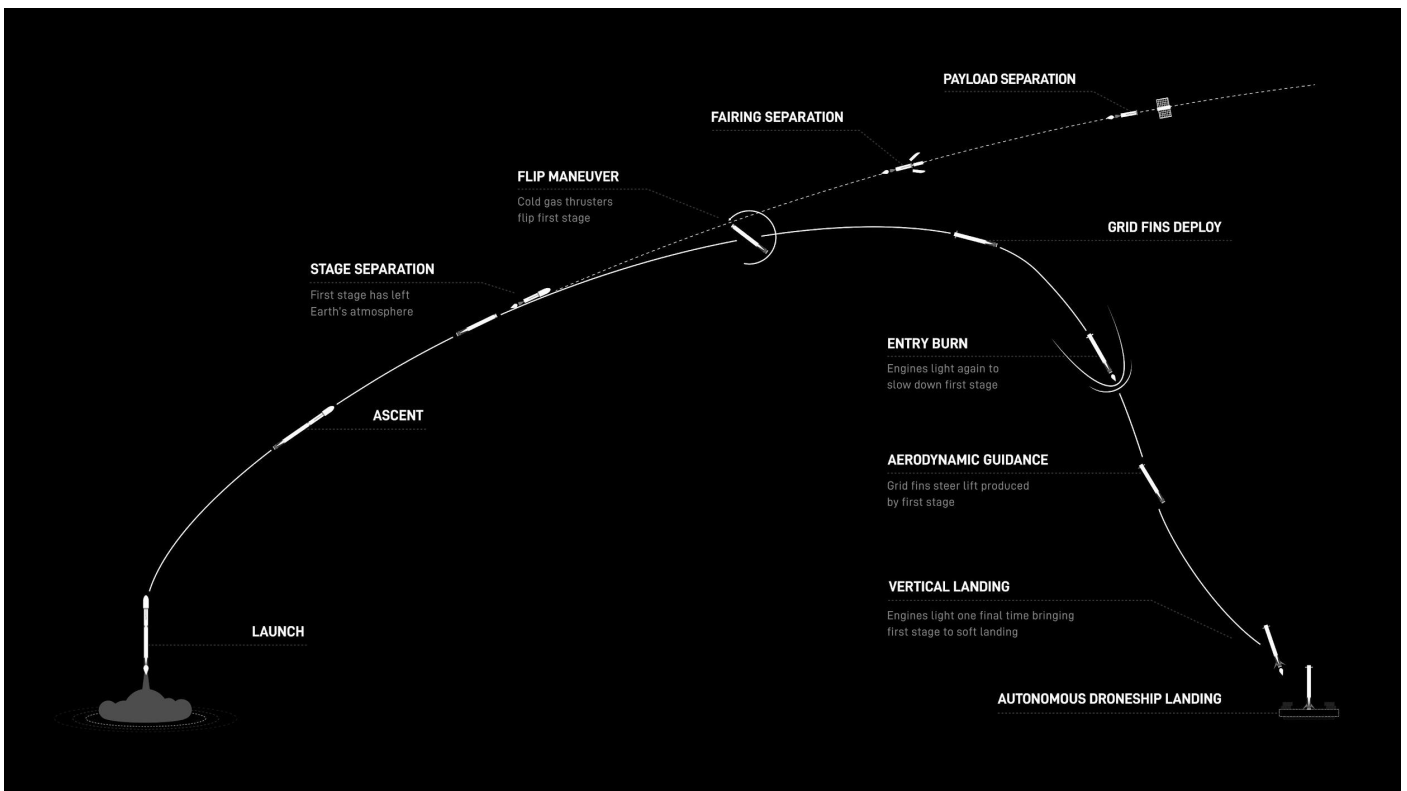
SpaceX is targeting Thursday, August 3 for Falcon 9's launch of the **IntelSat G-37 mission** to geosynchronous transfer orbit from Space Launch Complex 40 (SLC-40) at Cape Canaveral Space Force Station in Florida. The two-hour launch window opens at 12:15 a.m. ET (04:15 UTC). If needed, a backup opportunity is available Friday, August 4 with the same window.

WEBCAST

A live webcast of this mission will begin about 15 minutes prior to liftoff.

The first stage booster supporting this mission previously launched Crew-5, GPS III-6, Inmarsat I6-F2, CRS-28, and one Starlink mission. Following stage separation, the first stage will land on the Just Read the Instructions dronship, which will be stationed in the Atlantic Ocean.
